Clay Farm, Cambridge Development Guide



The Clay Farm development masterplanned by developer Countryside Properties together with Cambridge City Council and PRP Architects is located to the east of the village of Trumpington within walking distance of Cambridge City Centre.

Now fully complete, a variety of developers have delivered a total of 2,188 private and affordable homes set within three design coded character areas. A new 49ha Hobsons Park has also been provided together with new commercial and community facilities including two new schools, a community hub and community garden.

Set around a variety of mature existing and new landscape spaces the contemporary style homes range in size from studio, 1, 2 and 3 Bedroom Apartments through to 2,3,4 and 5 Bedroom Houses with 42% of the total number of homes being tenure blind affordable housing.

All homes achieve a minimum of Code for Sustainable Homes Level 3 and a variety of other sustainability measures have been incorporated.
